Future looking exciting for youth churches across the UK, Church Army review

A Church Army review of the Missional Youth Church Network (MYCN) has shown it is making good progress



# towards its target of establishing 30 missional youth churches in five years.

Missional Youth Churches (MYCs) enable 11- to 18-yearolds to build community and discover their faith, and each is particular to its own context and need.

MYCN now has contact with more than 100 leaders across the country with an interest in building churches with young people in their area. And since the Learning Community for youth leaders, clergy, pioneers, and school leaders launched online in 2020, 25 MYCs have started to develop and grow. Benefact Trust is supporting this exciting project with over £200,000 in funding.

The Church Army review has discovered that leaders have grown the most in their confidence and capability in building community with young people, sharing faith with them, and in discipleship with young people. One youth worker said: Church News Ireland Page 10

*"I've found it helpful to hear stories and methods of how to move unchurched young people from relationships and drop-ins into small groups where they explore faith."* 

MYCs look very different in a variety of communities across the UK. In Dinting Vale, Derbyshire, the Revd Nick Gurney has been running youth ministry sessions every Friday after school with a team of volunteers, engaging with 60 young people from the local secondary school. And for young people in Whitehaven, Cumbria, Alison and her team have been going into a school and leading a lunchtime craft club which has developed into a space where young people can share their hopes and dreams through different activities.

"The MYCN vision chimes with the Church of England's aim to be a younger and more diverse church of missionary disciples. MYCN Team members have tried and tested Anglican experience of working with unchurched young people and of forming new worshipping communities. They are well placed to offer practical, strategic and formational support to dioceses and churches." - **Stephen Cottrell**, **Archbishop of York**

# Boris Johnson's partygate legal fees cost taxpayer £265,000

Sky News - Angela Rayner, Labour's deputy leader, said the cost to the taxpayer was an "unprecedented and unacceptable waste" and called on Rishi Sunak to force Mr Johnson to hand the cash back.

Boris Johnson's legal defence fees for the probe into his role in the partygate scandal have topped £265,000, new figures have revealed.

The Cabinet Office said on Thursday the former prime minister's legal defence totalled £265,522 - a bill it paid as

Mr Johnson defended himself to the parliamentary committee.

Peters & Peters, the law firm used to provide Mr Johnson with legal advice, was handed a contract in August 2022 worth £129,000, although the Cabinet Office later estimated costs would rise to £222,000.

#### Carers to get National Living Wage as support hours cut

RTE News - The Government has announced increased funding for home carers provided by the State.

Minister for Health Stephen Donnelly said the extra money which will see carers paid at least the National Living Wage of €13.10 per hour - will "help address some of the key issues impacting recruitment and retention in the sector". The move also sees travel time included for the first time. State-funded home support is provided directly by the HSE and other providers in the private, community and voluntary sectors.

Mr Donnelly said: "The new higher rates will advance significant sectoral reform, and will, for the first time, incorporate travel time for home support providers, reform legacy rates, and ensure carers are paid the National Living Wage at a minimum.

"This promises to help maintain the high volumes of service delivery and to reduce waiting times for home support." In 2023 the overall home care budget is €723 million, the Department of Health said. **Church News Ireland**

## Odeon expects one million film goers as Barbenheimer released

Belfast Telegraph - Odeon has said one million customers are expected at its cinemas in the week following the release of Barbie and Oppenheimer.

Both films will be released on Friday, which has given rise to cinemagoers purchasing back-to-back tickets for what has been dubbed, Barbenheimer.

Odeon said thousands will see director Greta Gerwig's comedy about the famous doll Barbie and Christopher Nolan's biographical thriller on physicist J Robert

Oppenheimer and his role in developing the first atomic bomb on the same day.

The film chain reports that more than 200,000 advance tickets were purchased and more than 10,000 guests are expected to see both films in opening weekend.

The company said both productions, which have stars including Cillian Murphy, Florence Pugh, Margot Robbie and Ryan Gosling, are its biggest films of the year so far for advance sales.

The climate crisis and the struggle for migrant justice are deeply connected. Indigenous groups, small-scale farmers, and communities all over the world are being forcibly displaced by devastating floods, severe droughts and rising sea levels. While most are displaced within their own countries, a small number cross borders in search of safety.

These communities are often met with militarised, violent borders and hostile immigration systems. Rich, industrialised Global North countries — the biggest historic polluters and contributors to the climate crisis — are spending, on average, 2.3 times as much on arming their



borders as they are on providing financial support to the poorer Global South countries most impacted by the climate crisis.
