## Derry & Raphoe do it dry at Summer Madness

The rain held off for Derry & Raphoe Youth's annual barbecue at the Summer Madness festival, which took place in Portglenone again this year.



The event is Ireland's largest Christian youth festival and the Derry and Raphoe team of leaders looked after around 20 young people, from seven different churches in the Diocese.

This year's theme is 'Living Life on Purpose', with a strong signal to young people that what they choose to do with their lives matters, and that there's no better choice they can make than to choose Jesus Christ.

The festival takes place over five days – from Friday until Tuesday – and there's a huge variety of activities to keep youthful minds occupied. These include seminars, workshops, sports, games and gigs, and the highlight each day is the worship session in the Big Top, which draws hundreds to sing and pray together.



Derry & Raphoe Youth barbecue saw the Diocesan Youth Officer, Claire Hinchliff, step up to the plate – well, the grill, actually – and she was ably assisted by Pauline Beadle who took care of the vegetarian options on the menu. The chairman of D.R.Y., Rev Peter Ferguson, was there to lend a hand, literally, while no diocesan barbecue would be complete without a visit by C.I.Y.D.'s National Youth Officer, Simon Henry, who duly obliged by dropping in, just in time for lunch.

#### **Derry pilgrimage to Lourdes - day two**

A long day on pilgrimage! Today the diocesan group of pilgrims began their day with the celebration of Mass focussing on the call of Saint Bernadette.

Reminding the pilgrims of the pending visit of relics of the humble saint to the diocese this coming October, Bishop Donal preached about the call of God being given to the



lowliest and most unexpected people in the eyes of the world and yet are the ones who respond most generously to that call.

Following the group photograph and morning prayer with the youth participants, the diocesan programme continued with the way of the Cross, led by Bishop Donal on the high way and Fr Colm guiding the meditations in the sanctuary.

The afternoon culminated with participation in the Eucharistic Procession in which the bishop, priests and some young people played important roles.

After dinner, the pilgrims gathered at Chapelle Notre Dame for the penitential service and individual confessions thanks to the generosity of the diocesan clergy and some Irish Dominican friars.

#### **Cathedral Calls**

## Organ for Chapel of Unity at Belfast Cathedral

Patricia McKinley-Hutchinson (nee Beattie) and her brother Ian Beattie were present at the dedication of the "Beattie Organ" which has been installed in the Chapel of Unity at Belfast Cathedral.

The organ was originally built for the new church of St George's, Tufnell Park, in London. It was then moved to Armagh and finally to Bessbrook, from where it was transported to Belfast Cathedral.

After Choral Evensong on Sunday 30 June, the Dean, Stephen Forde, dedicated the refurbished chamber organ to the memory of Patricia and Ian's late father George A Beattie, who had been a pupil of Captain CJ Brennan in the 1920s.



Mr Beattie was appointed organist at Sinclair Seamen Memorial Church at the age of 16. He went on to be organist and choir master at Ulsterville Presbyterian Church, until the outbreak of war in 1939. From 1946, when he was resident manager of the Laharna Hotel in Larne, Mr Beattie was for many years organist and choir master at St Cedma's Parish Church in Larne.

Following the dedication, Belfast Cathedral Organist Jack Wilson and Assistant Organist, Stephen Hamill gave a recital to demonstrate the range and tonal qualities of the refurbished instrument.

Also present was Alistair McCartney, who undertook the refurbishment project, with assistance from Stephen Hamill, and cathedral organ scholars Daragh Magee and Finn Sloan.

The dedication and recital was followed by refreshments, which allowed those from Larne, and members of the cathedral choir and congregation to enjoy one another's company.

# Sister Nuala Kelly honoured by The University of Ulster


