Harding Memorial school history note



It all began.... due to a local need for a larger Church and school Canon Harding approached Lord Arthur Hill about a plot of ground on the Cregagh Road, Belfast

The Select Vestry of Willowfield Parish gave its support and the ground was secured. The first building open on the site was Dromore Street Hall on Saturday 25 February 1911 to be used for Divine Worship for Parishioners residing on the South side of the Parish.

Willowfield National School No 2 was opened officially on 5 April 1913. The school building consisted of two storeys, with 4 classrooms on each storey. The first Principal was Mr D. Moore.

Canon Harding was rector of Willowfield Parish from 1900-1922, his interest in the welfare of children led to his last great work the building of Willowfield No2 after his death in 1922 the school was renamed- Harding Memorial Primary School in his Honour

East Belfast Mission's Community Homes project nearing completion

Exciting times ahead! The Hosford Community Homes project at 240 Newtownards Road, Belfast, is nearing completion.

It will provide much needed housing and a fresh start for many.

This project has been generously funded by Urban Villages, Ulster Garden Villages, Benefact Trust, Garfield Weston and local churches, businesses and individuals.

240 Newtownards project is a unique, community-led housing initiative aimed at transforming an empty building into six apartments and a community space dedicated to fostering good relations.

The project provides a pathway for individuals transitioning from hostel accommodations to more permanent housing, which in turn frees up hostel spaces for others in need. It promotes increased independence for residents while



ensuring they still have access to essential support services.

Overall, this project takes a holistic, community-based approach to housing, creating a supportive environment where individuals can thrive.

Clients identified the

following needs -

"A house that is for the long term, not for a short term and moving around a lot."

"A private house. For me the most important thing is for a place to be safe and clean. It needs to have a good area, like a small flat. Safety is the most important thing for me."

"Somewhere secure. A private apartment where my family could visit me."

Middle East cease fire and hostage release welcomes

Christian Aid Ireland said - We welcome the ceasefire between Israel and Hamas but a ceasefire by itself does nothing to address the root causes of the conflict.

A sustainable peace is not possible until the illegal occupation of Gaza, the West Bank (including East Jerusalem) is ended and Palestinians and Israelis are treated as equals.

'At long last it offers people in Gaza respite from the relentless bombardment, displacement and deprivation they have endured for the last 15 months. It also means the welcome release of hostages and respite for their families

after long months of torment.' - William Bell, Head of Middle East Policy & Advocacy at Christian Aid.

For our partners on the ground, this ceasefire is a crucial window to scale up the humanitarian response.

They're gearing up to expand the distribution of vital supplies to communities who've endured months of devastation. Many Palestinians have been living in cold winter conditions, forced to move several times while facing near starvation and acute shortages.





Archbishop John McDowell and Archbishop Michael Jackson have welcomed the announcement of a proposed ceasefire and release of hostages in the current conflict in the Middle East. The full joint statement from the archbishops is as follows:

'This represents a fragile moment of opportunity, with the prospect of an end to the war in Gaza and the release of all hostages. We pray for blessing on peace—makers in every

community in the Middle East who build bridges and reconcile relationships between those divided by conflict.

'Beyond every number mentioned in reports of casualties in the region is an individual human being made in the image of God with value and dignity, regardless of their nationality or background. The needs of people who mourn or who have been displaced and injured must be foremost in our thoughts and prayers at this time.

'We hope that this development will lead to a just and lasting peace, the full supply of humanitarian aid to relieve extreme suffering now, and the healing of physical and mental wounds. This requires leadership which relentlessly pursues a desire for peace, over and above any lesser gain, for the well—being of the people who live in the lands in which Our Lord found his earthly home.'
