Andrew's Gibraltar

The welcome and installation of The Rt. Rev. Andrew Norman at the Cathedral of the Holy Trinity in Gibraltar on 2 March 2025. He was consecrated as Suffragan Bishop in Europe by the Archbishop of York at Canterbury Cathedral on 27 February 2025.

The Diocese of Gibraltar in Europe, known simply as the Diocese in Europe, was established in 1842. It is geographically the largest diocese in the Anglican Communion with its jurisdiction including 30 countries in

continental Europe, as well as Morocco and Turkey. Its 250 congregations are divided in to 140 chaplaincies in seven archdeaconries.

A beautiful service welcomed our new Suffragan Bishop in Europe, and he was installed in his own stall which very fittingly is dedicated to St Andrew!

Bishops' Spring 2025 General Meeting concludes in Maynooth

This week members of the Irish Catholic Bishops' Conference gathered in Saint Patrick's College, Maynooth, for their Spring 2025 General Meeting.

The President of the Conference is Archbishop Eamon Martin of Armagh, and the Vice-President is Archbishop Dermot Farrell of Dublin. During their meeting bishops' concelebrated Mass in Saint Mary's Oratory, with seminarians, lay and clergy staff in attendance. Bishops prayed for the improving health and recovery of the Holy Father Pope Francis, for peace in the Holy Land, and for a successful outcome to peace negotiations between Ukraine and Russia.

World Council of Churches urges dialogue and unity, not revenge in Syria

World Council of Churches general secretary the Rev. Jerry Pillay expressed deep sorrow and grave concern over the recent tragic developments in Syria, where, according to some sources, more than 1,000 civilians, primarily from the Alawite community, have been massacred.

"We underscore the joint statement issued by the Heads of Churches in Syria on Dec. 29, 2024, which expressed a vision for a new Syria based on reconciliation, dialogue, partnership, and hope," Pillay said on March 10. "Their call for a culture of dialogue and national unity remains more urgent than ever in the face of the ongoing violence and suffering."

He reaffirmed that violence only begets more violence and called on all Syrians to break free from this destructive cycle and work toward a future rooted in justice, healing, and peace. "Syria's tragic history reminds us that repeating past

atrocities will only perpetuate suffering and division," Pillay said. "Instead, we must strive for a reconciled society where the dignity of all is upheld."

St Mary's in Castro Church at Dover Castle

The Roman Pharos at Dover Castle is one of the oldest and most significant ancient structures in Britain.

The Romans built an octagonal tower-like lighthouse (pharos) on Castle Hill around the same time, with another on the opposite hill, the Western Heights. These lighthouses supported fire beacons to act as navigation lights for ships approaching the narrow river mouth, enabling them to find a quayside outside the fort. Dover Castle, Dover, England

First international 'Catholic Grandparents & Elderly' conference

As part of the Jubilee Year celebrations of the Catholic Church, the first ever Catholic Grandparents and Elderly International Conference will be held from 25 to 28 May at Villa Palazzola, Rome, just before the Jubilee for Families, Grandparents and the Elderly, on 30 May to 1 June.

The Catholic Grandparents' Association was officially launched during its third Grandparents' Pilgrimage to Knock in September 2009 – led by **Cardinal Séan Brady** the then Archbishop of Armagh. Ms Catherine Wiley: Marilyn Henry National International Coordinator of CGA; Apostolic Nuncio Archbishop Montemayor; Catherine Wiley, founder of the Catholic Grandparents Association; and former Eurovision Song Contest winner and MEP **Dana Rosemary Scallon** at the 2024 annual National Grandparents Pilgrimage in Knock – became the Founder of the Association and today



Archbishop Francis Duffy, Archbishop of Tuam, is the Patron.

Commenting on the upcoming conference in Rome, Ms Wiley said, "As we celebrate our 25th Jubilee, we reflect on the incredible journey of the Catholic Grandparents Association over the past 25 years. What began as a small pilgrimage to the Shrine of Our Lady of Knock, Ireland, has grown into a global mission to help Grandparents pass on

the faith and to keep prayer at the heart of family life. We have been blessed beyond measure by the unwavering support, guidance, and encouragement of the Bishops of Ireland, for which we remain profoundly grateful.

"Through the grace of God, we have had the privilege of pioneering, expediting, and establishing the World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly in the Universal Church. This year's theme, Blessed are those who have not lost hope (cf. Sir 14;2), reminds us of the perseverance of Grandparents, who never give up hope."

Ms Wiley concluded, "We grandparents have never given up hope, we asked Pope Benedict XVI to write a Prayer for Grandparents, and he did. We asked our Holy Father Pope Francis to proclaim a World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly, and he did. This is our legacy to the Church for our grandchildren and future generations. It is a never-ending search for ways and means to pass on our faith."
