Bishop David instituted Adrian, who will be known as Vicar, on Monday 11 November and Revd Bill Boyce, Rector of Dromore (Clogher Diocese), gave the address. Bill has also recently returned from warmer climes after over three years of ministry as Vicar of St Andrew's Church, Puerto Pollensa, Majorca. Adrian and Bill were colleagues in the Diocese in Europe.

#### **Revd Adrian Green**

Born in Belfast, Adrian grew up in Finaghy before leaving to join the Royal Navy. He also worked for several pharmaceutical companies prior to training at Trinity Theological College in Bristol.

After ordination Adrian served as curate at Willowfield and then led Mount Merrion Parish Church on the Cregagh estate. For the last three years he has been the Anglican chaplain for the islands of Ibiza and Formentera.

Adrian is married to Linda and they have five children and six grandchildren. They are excited about the opportunity of serving the people of Ballywalter.

He says, "We are looking forward to building upon all that has already been established here in making the church a place where individuals and families can belong and find purpose and meaning. Our desire is for Holy Trinity Church to be known as a place where everyone can encounter the miraculous power of what God's Holy Spirit can do for us, as together we seek to live life in all its fullness."


# Find Peace this Advent with CMHI's online retreats 'My Dwelling Place'

Simon Harris says politicians 'have to press reset on relationship with farmers' -The Journal

Political leaders visited the National Council of the Irish Farmers' Association in Dublin ahead of the general election.

There needs to be a reset in the relationship between Irish politicians and farmers, Taoiseach Simon Harris has said.

Speaking during a visit to the National Council of the Irish Farmers' Association (IFA) in Dublin, Harris said politicians talk about farming in a way they would not about any other part of the Irish economy.

He also said that the farming community requires support to help the sector to meet ambitious environmental targets.

The agriculture sector was the largest single source of greenhouse gas emissions last year, making up 34.3% of Ireland's emissions.

And though agriculture emissions fell by 4.6% in 2023 when compared to 2022, that represents only a 2.9% fall in emissions since 2018.

## Kick bishops out of Lords so they can focus on Church crisis, Commons told - Daily Telegraph

An SNP MP has said bishops should be removed from the House of Lords so they can focus on fixing their own crisis in the Church of England.

Pete Wishart, the MP for Perth and Kinross-shire, suggested members of the clergy would be better off dealing with the row behind the Archbishop of Canterbury's resignation than attempting to "run our country".

He was among roughly 40 MPs to back an unsuccessful attempt in the Commons on Tuesday to remove the 26 bishops from the upper chamber, claiming they had a "whole range" of other issues to concern themselves with.

## Easier for students to come out as gay than Christian - Christian Post

In schools across Northern Ireland, students are finding it more challenging to reveal their Christian faith than their

sexual orientation, according to testimony provided during an ongoing inquiry into Relationship and Sexuality Education (RSE) at Stormont.

David Smyth, a representative of the Evangelical Alliance Northern Ireland, told the Education Committee that some young people find it "much more difficult now to come out as an Evangelical Christian in school than it is to come out as LGBT," according to the BBC.



Smyth's comments came as part of a discussion on the content and delivery of RSE in Northern Irish schools.

# Catholic priests urged to demand access to personal information on them held by the church - Irish Independent

The Association of Catholic Priests (ACP) has said it is unhappy about the way Irish priests' personal data is being processed by church authorities and has told clergy they should demand to see the files bishops hold on them.

At its AGM in Athlone, members of the priests' group heard Fr Tim Hazelwood explain their rights and protections under data protection legislation, one of which is that they are entitled to a copy of their own personal file.

"You have the right to be informed about any personal data that is held on you and the purpose for which it is used," he said.

The Co Cork parish priest said the ACP was concerned because priests are not being told about the retention of files in diocesan offices and religious orders, nor are they aware of their right to access that data.

# Harassed and called paedophiles: Librarians share trauma of being targeted by anti-LGBT+ groups - The Journal

Librarians have reported feeling "intense" stress and trauma after being targeted by campaigners who disagree with libraries stocking LGBTQIA material and programming inclusive events, according to a new report.

Several libraries around Ireland have been targeted because they supply LGBTQIA-related reading material or hold drag story events where drag queens or kings (usually men dressed as women or women dressed as men) read age-appropriate stories to children.

In some cases, reading material was burned by protesters and staff were threatened. In July 2023, Cork City Library was forced to close amid fears for employees' safety due to an anti-LGBTQIA protest.

A number of people have been charged in relation to such incidents in Ireland. The campaign is part of an international trend where libraries in various countries have been targeted.

IRA's bomb murder of retired RUC reservist and his wife among 14 cases to be probed by new Troubles legacy body - News Letter

Along with 13 other cases, the 1990 murder by car bomb of James and Ellen Sefton is to be examined by the

Independent Commission for Reconciliation and Information Recovery (ICRIR).

The commission was created by the Conservative government's controversial Legacy Act, which halted scores of civil cases and inquests into Troubles deaths.

Bereaved families, victims and certain public authorities can instead request the ICRIR carry out an investigation.

Current schools' estate strategy unsustainable, warns watchdog report - Belfast Telegraph



The condition of Northern Ireland's schools' estate is deteriorating and the current strategy for managing it is unsustainable, an Audit Office report has warned.

The report said a new approach is required from Stormont's Department of Education to make better use of limited funding for maintenance and capital investment.

Comptroller and Auditor General Dorinnia Carville's said her findings suggested the department "does not have a full understanding" of the true condition of the schools' estate.

There are more than 1,100 schools in Northern Ireland — with a total estimated capital value of £4.6bn. In 2023-24, the department recorded a total capital expenditure of £276.4m across the estate, and a spend of £28.4m on maintenance.
