

First anniversary of Creeslough tragedy

Creeslough prepares to mark first anniversary since tragedy stole ten lives and devastated the country

Belfast Live reports - Those who died included three children aged 5, 13 and 14.

It will be a gathering of hearts still learning to live with the unparalleled tragedy that struck in Creeslough last year. In a week's time on Saturday, October 7, the Donegal community will welcome friends, families and support from across the country into their midst once more as they honour the ten victims of an explosion at flats above a petrol station.

Next Saturday, an anniversary memorial mass and commemoration will be held at 3pm at the site of the explosion. It will be followed at 7.30pm by a Vigil Mass to honour those who died in the tragedy, those who were injured and those who responded with help and support on the day and in the weeks and months since.

On Wednesday, 20th September 2023, the Archdeacon of Cork, Cloyne and Ross, the Ven. Andrew Orr was installed into his stall at St Colman's Cathedral, Cloyne. The Choir of Midleton College as well as the Clerks Choral sang Choral Evensong.

MindMatters was launched on World Mental Health Day 2020 with the aim of increasing awareness of mental health within the Church and promoting a greater understanding of mental health issues.

The project began by commissioning extensive research, including the largest survey on mental health attitudes ever carried out by a Church on the island. The results of the

survey and focus groups provided an evidence—based foundation for subsequent activities.

Following on from the research, MindMatters organised a series of Mental Health Awareness training sessions, attended by, among others, all 12 (at the time) members of the House of Bishops. This enthusiastic and visible support from the Church leadership has been a significant contributor to the success of the project to date. Over 400 people have attended training at the time of writing.

The third phase of the project has been the provision of 'seed funding' to a total of 74 local initiatives spread throughout the island of Ireland.

Knock Shrine adult faith formation course part of new online/in-person event programme

"A timely foundation course ideal for anyone wishing to deepen their faith or involved in parish ministries, diocesan or parish councils"

Knock Shrine is inviting people to a new series of faith renewal events, offering the opportunity to reflect and engage in a range of faith-based workshops, discussions, and events. The programme includes an adult faith formation course, thought-provoking online discussions on the 'Synod on Synodality' in the Vatican, a creative and inspirational sacred art workshop in December, as well as the enchanting 'Carols by Candlelight' concert and a healing Reconciliation Service.

Especially in the context of the 'Synod on Synodality', which is in session from 4 – 29 October, this timely programme has been developed by the Faith Renewal Council at Knock Shrine to offer people the opportunity to explore their faith and to engage in discussion and reflection of contemporary Church issues.

Father Richard Gibbons PP, Rector of Knock Shrine, said, "These faith renewal events aim to encourage and help people in their faith. Our programme has been designed to have a broad appeal, and so is wide-ranging in content. We offer something for everybody, and we welcome and encourage people to take part."

The timing of the programme is to help deepen the Christian's journey through the holy seasons of Advent and into Christmas. Nicola Mitchell, the Faith Renewal Coordinator at Knock Shrine, and member of the Faith Renewal Council, said, "We are delighted to launch this new programme for the autumn and winter season as it provides people with the opportunity to engage in a variety of faith events both in-person and online. It is the perfect time of year to engage in a new course or workshop to enrich our faith as we journey through Advent. With the Synod in Rome in mind, we felt that it was important to focus on faith renewal events in the hope that there will be something of relevance to everyone."

Programme of events

Father Eugene Duffy, a priest of the Diocese of Achonry, will kick-start the new faith renewal programme with What Do We Know About Jesus?, an evening faith formation course that will focus on the life of Christ. It will provide a foundation for those who want to deepen their own faith and be in a position to share it with others. The course will run on Tuesday evenings from 3 October until 21 November at Saint John's Welcome Centre. Participants are invited to register online at Eventbrite, and further details are available on knockshrine.ie

Father Eugene is currently the Episcopal Vicar for Pastoral Development and Renewal in Achonry. He previously taught theology at Mary Immaculate College, Limerick, ATU Galway and All Hallows College, Dublin. Father Eugene said, "The programme would be an ideal foundational course for those engaged in Parish Ministries, Diocesan or Parish Pastoral Councils." Other aspects of the programme will include:

'The Synod on Synodality: Reflecting on the Proceedings in Rome', will involve a series of online discussions with distinguished participants of the Synod. During these online discussions, they will share their expertise and insights with other notable experts to help develop an understanding of the key outcomes of the assembly in Rome. It is hoped that the conversations will be of particular interest to members of Diocesan and Parish Pastoral Councils, as well as to the general public.

While dates have yet to be confirmed, it is expected that this series will begin in November and will be streamed on knockshrine.ie.

In December, Dr Nora Donnelly will host a sacred art workshop entitled Seeing is Believing: Reflecting on Art as a Glimpse of the Sacred. These illustrated lectures will take place over two consecutive Saturday mornings in the peaceful surrounds of the Taizé Room in the Prayer Centre at Knock Shrine. Using well-known works of art to explore depictions of the sacred in art, the lectures will focus on works relating to Mary, the Holy Family and the Nativity. It is hoped that these images will open the door to a deeper,

broader, and more reverend understanding of what Christmas can mean to the thinking Christian. Nora is an educator and art critic as well as an artist. She has taught both at primary and university levels, and has written extensively about the value of art as an experience to humankind.


Other events will include the annual November Remembrance Mass, and the all-night Vigil in celebration of the Feast of the Immaculate Conception beginning on the night of 7 December and which will go into the early hours of 8 November on the theme 'A Light to Enlighten the World.' The much-loved Carols by Candlelight will take place at Knock Basilica on 17 December, followed by the Advent Reconciliation Service on 19 December.

Former choirboy turned official portrait painter at Blackburn Cathedral

Blackburn Cathedral says a risky decision for the official portrait of a retired bishop, has proven to be a success.

Displaying an official portrait of past incumbents is a traditional way to honour the role retiring bishops and deans have played in the life of a diocese. The same goes for US Presidents, monarchs, and Lords - and Ladies - of the manor.

It's a prestigious commission, rarely given to anyone not already appreciated for their artistic talent. But in a break with custom, Blackburn Cathedral agreed to offer the job to

a former choirboy. Jack Aspinall said he'd had no formal training or art lessons, but asked if he could "have a go".

He's now part of the virging team and wanted to be the one to paint the retired bishop, the Rt Revd Julian Henderson, which he agreed to do with, "no strings attached and no promise it would hang as the official portrait."

The former bishop, who retired in July 2022, returned to the diocese last week to unveil the result.

The study in oil will hang on the wall in Blackburn cathedral's undercroft – and will also feature in an exhibition of Aspinall's other works, in the cathedral's Temple Gallery.

The Dean of Blackburn, the Very Revd Peter Howell Jones said: "I wasn't convinced to be honest... but he persuaded us to let him... and I'm very pleased we did, not just for the cathedral but for Jack, whose dream has now become a reality."

The work will be on display in the Temple Gallery until mid-October.
