"If you are at the NPC, do drop by at our area with the thousands of others who will do so next week and have a free cuppa and chat.



Pope weighs in on US election, branding Harris and Trump 'against life'


The Pope has weighed in on the US presidential election, in a rare move for the pontiff, who is usually politically neutral.


The service of music and readings took place at St Anne's Cathedral, hosted by John Toal.

The Ulster Orchestra was conducted by James Burtron and the Cathedral Organist and Master of Music Jack Wilson. The Codetta Choir sang under the artistic director Donal Doherty.

The BBC presenters Tara Mills and Declan Harvey gave readings including poems from Seamus Heaney and Michael Longley, and excerpts of reports and speeches from the time the BBC locally was launched in 1924 in a converted building near to where the corporation is now based in Linenhall Street. The current headquarters opened during the war in 1941.

The concert was broadcast on Sunday evening on BBC Radio Ulster and Radio Foyle.


Architectural inheritance of the C of I - focus of Church of Ireland Historical Society
