National Parliamentary Prayer Breakfast

Dr Amy Orr-Ewing delivered the keynote message on The Power of Forgiveness in Public Life.

She said, 'The instinct in culture that harm matters so profoundly that a person must pay, must perhaps even die some kind of social or professional death for their transgression, points beyond itself to the echo of a story that has given meaning to millions of people around the world for over 2,000 years.

as we heard in the reading, his death is described in the New Testament as a ransom, an offering, and a sacrifice. He pays a price for the transgressions of the world that means that forgiveness can be real. The price we all intuitively sense must be paid for harm, is actually paid by Jesus.'

'The Christian offer of forgiveness is for everyone – to receive it and to be empowered to give it.'

'In practical terms, I want to suggest that the concept of Christian forgiveness is a gift to any culture. Forgiveness and redemption are possible, and outrage at injustice has a foundation in reality.

'The Christian message acknowledges that wrongdoing is real and that there is a real need for justice. It challenges us to admit that all of us are flawed in some way ourselves. All of us, also need forgiveness.'

The Festival week will build on the successes of previous years, with big opportunities for community outreach and participation.


The programme promises a great mix of services, concerts, lessons and masterclasses in Armagh city's churches.

Lead C of E bishop for housing backs Prince of Wales homelessness project

Church of England's lead bishop for housing Dr Guli Francis-Dehqani backs Prince of Wales bid to end homelessness

The Church of England's lead bishop for housing Dr Guli Francis-Deqhani, has welcomed the launch of the five-year

Homewards project by the Prince of Wales to end long term homelessness.

"I am delighted to see the personal commitment the Prince of Wales has made to ending homelessness," she said.

"Across the Church of England we share this desire to tackle the underlying causes as well as supporting those in crisis.

"The leadership of the Prince of Wales will undoubtedly have a tangible impact; his determination to address this crisis will be welcomed by churches up and down the country who are on the front line of supporting those experiencing homelessness.

"Ending homelessness does indeed require a societal response, and we will play our part.

"The Coming Home report from the Archbishops' Commission on Housing, Church and Community set out the role that the Church can play in addressing a lack of truly affordable and high quality housing - a major factor behind homelessness.

"We are working to bring about that vision, and are grateful for the wisdom and encouragement from the Duchy of Cornwall and Royal Foundation.

"Good homes provide a foundation for communities where everyone can flourish. Together we have substantial resources to bring to bear, and so we look forward to adding

In this week in history -Coventry's St Michael and the Devil

The magnificent St Michael and the Devil statue created by Sir Jacob Epstein was unveiled by Lady Epstein at Coventry Cathedral on the 24th June 1960.

This was Epstein's last commission and at the time was seen to be controversial. St Michael's head is modelled on the sculptor's son-on-law, Wynne Godley and the wings based on those of a swan. 
