Cardinal Nichols says Alfie Evans case 'used for political aims'

Cardinal Vincent Nichols has defended Alder Hey hospital's role in the Alfie Evans case.

During a visit to Poland on Sunday, the cardinal [reportedly criticised](#) people who "sought political capital" from the case, and said some who took a stand on the case "didn't serve the good of the child". "It's important to remember Alder Hey Hospital cared for Alfie not for two weeks or two months, but for 18 months, consulting with the world's top specialists – so its doctors' position that no further medical help could be given was very important," he said, according to The Tablet.

began at the intersection of Yonge and Finch streets, just north of where the first victim was struck by the speeding van. Following a prayer by Kevin Robertson, area bishop of York-Scarborough, participants walked southward along part of the alleged assailant's route, past makeshift memorials of flowers, until they reached the Anglican Church of St George on Yonge, near which another pedestrian had been killed.
