St Patrick's Profession of Faith in the Trinity

RHS: We believe in Him and we look for His coming soon as judge of the living and of the dead, who will treat all persons according to their deeds.

LHS: He has poured out the Holy Spirit on us in abundance. The gift and guarantee of eternal life, who makes those who believe and obey Sons of God and joint heirs with Christ.

RHS: We acknowledge and adore Him and as God in the Trinity of the Holy Name. **ALL: Glory be to the Father, and....**

A Reflective Prayer on the Breastplate

Rt Rev David Chillingworth

Sermon preached in St Patrick's Cathedral Dublin on 17 March, 2008. Short, crisp and informative - would you expect anything else? Starts with the image of the St Patrick's Centre in Downpatrick, works in celtic mission via Iona. Basic question asked - is whether the heritage of Patrick – the Christian faith planted on this island – has a contribution to make to Ireland and to the world today. Bishop David says, "I think that the great movements taking place in Irish society – the shifting of social, cultural and religious tectonic plates – provide a new set of opportunities for the rediscovery and the replanting of the faith of Patrick." He points to three of them:to three of them.

- 1. The Celtic saints took their faith to remote places taking a commitment of love to remote places.
- 2. the opportunity to recapture the faith of Patrick so that it can build bridges not divide.
- 3. The challenge of modern secular Ireland "Celtic Spirituality offers ways to faith for people who want to pray in simplicity and who integration and meaning in life and faith, faith and the world."
